## CAPER BUSH

By 1633 Grow in very sheltered position, or give glasshouse protection. A shrub, the unopened flower buds providing the basis for pickled capers. "They stir up an appetite to meat... They are eaten boiled (the salt first washed off) with oile and vineger, as other sallads be, and sometimes are boiled with meat." **20 seeds £1.85p**

## ICE PLANT

Introduced 1727. "A spreading, round-stemmed plant.....the thickness and slightly acid flavour of the fleshy part of the leaves have caused it to be used as a fresh table vegetable for summer use in warm, dry countries". 1905 **250 seeds £1.75p**

## SAFFRON

**BULBS:** ❁ (*C. sativus*). Autumn flowering. "This floure doth first rise out of the ground nakedly in September, and his long small grassie leaves shortly after the floure, never bearing floure and leafe at once. The floure consisteth of six small blew leaves tending to purple, having in the middle many small yellow strings or threds; among which are two, three or more thicke fat chives of a fierie colour somewhat reddish, of a strong smell when dried, which doth stuffe and trouble the head"

## SCURVY GRASS

"It has long been considered as the most effectual of all the antiscorbutic plants; and its sensible qualities are sufficiently powerful to confirm this opinion. We have testimony of its great use in scurvy, it has been justly noticed, that this plant grows plentifully in those high latitudes where the scurvy is most obnoxious." 1816 **50 seeds £1.55p**

## STRAWBERRY

**Reugen** or **Baron Solemacher**. Wild strawberry type, with red aromatic fruits. **150 seeds £1.75p**

**Yellow Wonder.** Cream/yellow variety. The white fruits not so much visited by birds. **100 seeds £1.75p**

**True Wild Strawberry** **100 seeds £1.95p**

## SWEETCORN

**Golden Bantam.** Introduced in 1902 The variety was already old when (re)discovered in 1898 by Mr E L Coy. Originally raised by Mr J G Pickett of Greenfield Massachusetts, who is believed to have selected the variety from an older 19th century variety called Golden Sweet.

**Black Aztec.** Listed by Messr's Burr in 1863 as "Black Sweet." "the epicurean of vegetable morsels may not rest in his search for the acme of sweetcorn until he has eaten black Mexican fresh from the field." 1934
